

William Procter Jr.

- Date of Birth: May 3, 1817
- Baltimore, Maryland
- Raised a Quaker
- Left school early and worked in a cooper shop.
- Worked as an apprentice for Henry M. Zollickoffer's pharmacy in Philadelphia at 14.

- Opened drug store in 1844
- Professor at Philadelphia College of Pharmacy - 1846
- Author/Editor of *Practical Pharmacy: The Arrangement, Apparatus and Manipulations of the Pharmaceutical Shop and Laboratory* - 1849

William Procter Jr. (May 3, 1817 – February 10, 1874) was an American pharmacist known for his role in establishing the **American Pharmacists Association** and his work on the United States Pharmacopeia.



He was the author/editor of the first pharmacy textbook published in America. He is generally regarded as the **Father of American Pharmacy**.

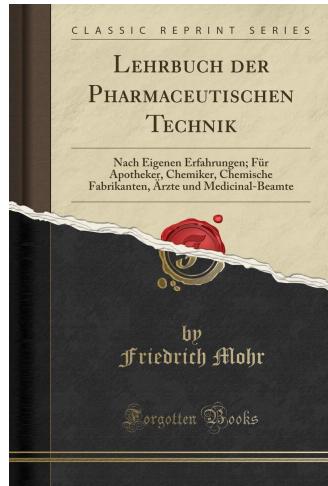

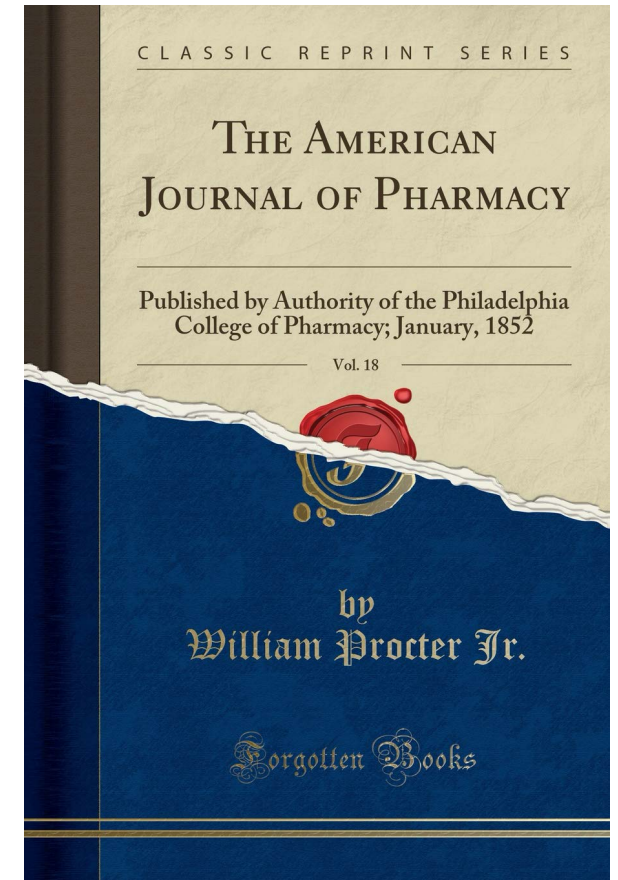

- Served on USP Revision Committee for 30 years
- Editor of American Journal of Pharmacy for 22 years



- Death: February 10, 1874
- Chicago College of Pharmacy passed a resolution
- “Father of American Pharmacy”
